OUR CURRICULUM

We are proud of our broad, diverse and ambitious curriculum which enables students to achieve the best results.

At KS3 all students study English, maths, science, history, geography, modern foreign language, dance, drama, religious studies, art, photography, music, physical education and computing.

During Year 9, our families receive high levels of guidance and support so that students select the GCSE options that best reflect their passions and interests.

At KS4 all students study English, maths and science, and either geography or history. The English Baccalaureate is available to all students.

We offer a comprehensive programme of support and guidance for post-16 pathways, including sixth form interviews and one-to-one meetings with our careers advisor and scholarship application support to prestigious sixth forms.

Morning roll call

Students at Orchard Park come to school each day looking smart, in full school uniform, fully equipped, with their homework completed and ready to have a productive day of learning. This is checked by form tutors every morning and is the best way to ensure the day is successful. Our mantra is 'win the morning, win the day!'

Tutor reading

We read together for 25 minutes every morning. Our unique and inspiring reading programme gives our students the opportunity to read brilliant literature every morning. By reading to them, we are able to supplement the text with valuable context and vocabulary that boosts student knowledge and understanding.

Classes

Our lessons are free from disruption. Students are challenged to learn lots, think hard and produce work of a very high standard. Each lesson recaps previous learning and involves silent, independent work. Our classrooms are highly inclusive.

Lunch time

All year groups have their own playground and students have a wealth of extra-curricular clubs and study support to choose from during lunchtimes.

Afternoon

Afternoon lessons at Orchard Park begin with explicit vocabulary instruction. KS3 learners are taught new vocabulary including etymology and application.
